Welcome & Introduction of Attendees

**Old Business:-**

Minutes from the April 14, 2009 meeting were approved with no revisions. Treasurer's report was accepted and the budget for 2010-11 was adopted. It was announced that the Taxing District would receive less highway repair and maintenance funds because the State Legislature has allocated less funds to counties and taxing districts.

Marilyn Mazuzan was nominated and elected to serve on the town board.

**BRAC**

The proposal from 2009-2010 to take property from the Rogentine home to the corner of Old Georgetown road was abandoned after the residents on both sides of Oakmont came together, lobbied, and urged the project not be started. The grant for funding the tunnel has not been awarded.

**Suburban Hospital**

A report from the Board of Appeals will be issued sometime at the end of the month. The release of the report has been postponed two times and no meetings have been held.

**NIH**

Oakmont is not affected by changes on the campus. The building near Greentree Road will be extended and Federal stimulus money will help pay for that project.

**Parking Report**

Irwin Faibisch reminded residents to check their parking decals to be sure they are not faded. Residents can replace decals and request temporary guest passes as needed. Please call in advance. Parking congestion is easing but every so often there is an occasional problem at Oak Place near Old Georgetown.

#### Town Building Ordinance

We have an ordinance for new homes and homes undergoing major renovations.

#### Tree Work

The committee will reevaluate any damage to trees from the winter storms and take appropriate action. The tree in front of 5614 Oakmont Ave. needs topsoil.

#### Oakmont Avenue curbs

Oakmont will not pursue having the County replace all curbs because both sides of Oakmont Avenue do not want the street widened. It was decided to let the issue die. There is damage to several curbs and to the apron at 5614 Oakmont Avenue. The Committee will ask if the county can do the repairs because the damage was done by a county snow plow. If not, the town will get estimates. Eric Moskowitz volunteered to walk around Oakmont and assess curb and apron damage on all properties. If necessary, the Oakmont Committee will have contractors give us estimates for damage repair and repairs will be made.
