**Financial Report-** Oakmont is solvent. There is money in both the checking and savings accounts.

**Parking Report-** There is nothing to report this month.

**Suburban Hospital-** The hospital group is disappointed that the plans were not accepted. A new plan incorporating the 5 recommendations may be submitted.

**BRAC-** On July 20 there will be a meeting at BC-C High School to present the options for road improvement and changes. The meeting is open to the public and the committee will discuss the options after the public presentation.

**NIH** All is fine for now. Marilyn informed us that the Porter building will have an addition put on it but it will not impact our view from Old Georgetown Rd. Stimulus money will pay for the addition.

**Other :**

**Daley Lane** – It was cleaned out and the contractor will be paid for his services. Mike is going to contact 3 contractors to get estimates about handling the gravel in Daley Lane or repaving Daley Lane.

**Picnic** - Ruth Gold will be contacted about planning the picnic and making sure that she is available to chair the committee for the picnic scheduled Saturday Sept. 11.

**Trees-** Mike will contact 2 contractors to get estimates for any trimming that may need to be done. It was suggested that one bidder be the firm we employed last year. The residents at 5623 Oak Place will be asked if they would like to have a tree planted to replace the tree that was removed last year. The committee discussed the importance of tree replacement when trees are removed.

**Curbs-** Mike will check on curb specifications because it was pointed out that there is a gap between the curbs and grass which could possibly cause injury.

**Street Signs-** the signs have been cleaned.

**Directory-** It is almost complete. There are three new families who have moved to the town.

**Underground Power Lines-** Mike will contact Pepco to ask for names of contractors to give us an estimate of the cost of putting utility lines under ground. This is the just the first step of exploring the opportunity to put lines underground.
